7. Project Description :

The project is about enabling the survivors of Typhoon Milenyo from the selected villages of Antipolo City and Montalban in Rizal province to recover from the destructive effects of the disaster. This is through a) helping them rehabilitate their agriculture-based livelihood activities, b) developing their capacity to managed community-based public health program, c) enhancing their capability to manage and respond to disasters should these come in the future, and d) improving their skills in implementing community-based development projects.

## 9. Expected Results :

- 600 families are able to produce their own food and to earn cash income.
- Twenty (20) community leaders are equipped with the basics of disaster preparedness and management. These leaders would later re-echo their learning to the other members of their respective communities.
- Twenty (20) community leaders are equipped with appropriate knowledge on basic health concepts and basic health skills. These leaders would later re-echo their learning to the other members of their respective communities.
- Twenty (20) community leaders are equipped with practical knowledge and techniques on raising goats and chicken. These leaders would later re-echo their learning to the other members of their respective communities.
- The local organizations are strengthened.
